BUILDING PURCHASE AGREEMENT COMPLETED 8/15/23

God continues to bless us! The owner of the building that we have been leasing has sold the building to us for \$90,000. A major contributor from Seattle, Washington has already donated \$24,000 towards this purchase and by good stewardship of your ongoing donations to help us “save babies, change lives, and help churches build community” since we began seeing patients in September 2020 we will use \$21,000 from our current cash reserve as our down payment towards this purchase. We hope to raise an additional \$45,000 during the next year to apply towards this purchase so that on August 15, 2024 we will own outright 5131 W. Bristol, Suite A with NO MORTGAGE OR LEASE PAYMENT to hinder our ability to carry out our mission and still have \$45,000 in cash reserve. Pray for God’s provision and be that if you can.
